Blacksburg and Alexandria - Assistant Professor

Virginia Tech invites applicants for two tenure-track faculty positions at the assistant professor level in its Urban Affairs and Planning (UAP) program, one to be located at the main campus in Blacksburg, and the other to join UAP faculty at the program's Alexandria, Virginia location. We seek candidates with a strong record of scholarship and teaching in one or more of the following areas: international development, technology, urban design, sustainability, and comparative urbanization. A Ph.D. in urban planning, urban geography, or related fields is required by the start date of August, 2012. Teaching responsibilities will be in the UAP un-

dergraduate and graduate programs, including the B.S. in Environmental Policy and Planning (EPP), B.A. in Public and Urban Affairs (PUA), Master of Urban and Regional Planning and the Ph.D. in Planning, Governance and Globalization.

UAP is one of three academic programs in the School of Public and International Affairs (SPIA) in Virginia Tech's College of Architecture and Urban Studies. The other programs are Public Administration and Policy and Government and International Affairs. All three programs operate at the main campus in Blacksburg and at the National Capital Region (NCR) campus in Alexandria, VA.

Applications and supporting documents must be submitted online at www.jobs.vt.edu (paper documents cannot be accepted). Applicants with a location preference should reference posting #0110955 for the Blacksburg position or posting #0110956 for the NCR position. Applicants wishing to be considered for both positions should apply to both. Complete applications should include: a full curriculum vitae, two samples of written work, teaching evaluations if available, and names and contact information for three references. Applicants must also submit a cover letter that addresses their qualifications, a statement about their current and future research agendas, and an overview of their teaching experience.
